Planning overview for AUTUMN TERM 2018


Each student will have a curriculum journey that is personalised for them. However as a Sixth form the department will be following shared areas of study to ensure breadth and variety in what is being offered as part of the 5 Lifestyles curriculum over the 3 years a young person attends our Sixth form. Students are able to achieve accreditation for their work. Functional Maths, English and ICT are planned according to need and are taught as discrete subjects as well as embedded throughout all areas of the curriculum.
