


**Springhead Sixth form

Each student will have a curriculum journey that is personalised for them. However as a Sixth form the department will be following shared areas of study to ensure breadth and variety in what is being offered as part of the 5 Lifestyles curriculum over the 3 years a young person attends our Sixth form.
